September 25, 2023

I. Call to order

President Lindy Edmond called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 6:01 p.m. on September 25, 2023 at Youth Center of Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the August 21, 2023 General Meeting as published in the September newsletter were approved on a motion by Susan Solomonson, second by Janice Stillwell. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

- **Treasurer Report** Michele Rustigan was absent. Lindy Edmond reported the August ending balance as \$20,421.94. Motion to approve the Guild's August treasurer's report as published in the September newsletter by Belinda Evans and seconded by Jeannie Mazzacane. All in favor and 0 opposed.
- b) Membership Laurie Nahay reported 83 members. 2024 membership will be in the October newsletter and can begin turning in one's membership in November. Lindy Edmond reported there no new submittals in the Idea Box but a previous submittal was addressed by the board. Previous submittal was a suggestion to have all daytime general meetings. 




