# **Binding Workshop - Sue Merritt**

Bring your completed table runner project from the August workshop or a small quilt that needs binding. Do not trim, we'll do that in class. You will also need the following:

- 1. Enough 3" binding strips to bind your table runner/quilt, do not sew your binding strip together.
- 2. Thread that matches your binding.
- 3. A small clear ruler 6" is a good size.
- 4. 6" to 9" square up ruler.
- 5. An iron and ironing mat. We do have irons and ironing boards but it will be easier if you have your own.
- 6. General sewing supplies and sewing machine.
- 7. Your lunch!!!!

It was an outstanding way to kick off the Quilt Show.













Guild Member Heidi Llanes' Mother Judy was the lucky winner of the 2023 Opportunity Quilt. Congratulations Judy!








