MINUTES -

Sandi Cannarella made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 20, 2015 meeting. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT -

Bonnie Snell made a motion that the July 2015 Treasurer's Report be accepted with the following amendments: *Picnic - \$38.14, Rent \$50.00.* Motion passed.

1VP -

Lorraine Taylor is making arrangements for our annual Christmas Dinner at Evergreen Restaurant on Monday December 7.

PROGRAMS -

Jeannie Mazzacane introduced the following program planning proposals on behalf of Janet Schultz, who is ill and unable to be with us this month:

1. Consider the possibility of scheduling our meetings during the day for winter months, to improve travel conditions for our members.

2. Explore the options for cutting back on paid speakers and workshops, since enrollment hasn't been meeting the cost of hiring guest teachers.

Both proposals will be discussed further in the coming months. Lorraine Taylor suggested putting out an interest survey to our members to see what other changes or topics we might want to look into.

Tomorrow's Boutique Sewing Day will be cancelled due to lack of participation.

Karen Cumberland shared information about a free-motion quilting workshop being offered by Big Bear Lake Quilters Guild. This workshop is scheduled for September 19, and Busy Bears Guild members are invited to enroll.

SUNSHINE AND SHADOWS -

Cat Harris brought us up to date on Sunshine and Shadows news.

QUILT SHOW -

Jeannie Mazzacane announced that Quilt Show entry forms are being collected tonight. She invited everyone to attend the judging on September 1. Karen Cumberland reviewed the procedures and schedules for all upcoming Quilt Show activities. Many volunteer are still needed in order to make the show a success. Bonnie Snell discussed take-down procedures, and shared details about ordering lunches on show days. Barbara Olsen went over the plans for the Friday Potluck. Fran Martin is seeking more volunteers to help with hanging quilts. Laurie Nahay shared the vendor list.

Quilt Show (continued)

Cat Harris talked about Boutique procedures and guidelines. After discussion, it was decided to make credit card transactions available to Boutique shoppers. Covering the fees for this capability, in addition to the guild's share of 15%, and 8% for sales tax, will increase the percentage subtracted by the guild to 26% of the seller's ticket prices. Sellers are responsible for including this amount in their prices. Mary Price is still seeking donations for raffle baskets. Mary Baughman is looking for teddy bears and small furniture items to borrow for use as 'safety decorations' at the show.

Jeannie Mazzacane reminded members that this year's Nominating Committee will begin meeting soon, and encouraged everyone to be ready to volunteer.

- **Big Bear Lake Quilter's Guild** has extended an invitation to all of us to join them at a Free Motion Quilting Class. The class is being offered Saturday, September the 19th at 9:30 am at Summit Christian Fellowship on Garstin Rd. The instructor is Heidi Stagno from Heidi's Longarm Quilting
- Center in Calimesa. The class will be using your domestic machine, but the same principles can be also translated to a longarm machine. - October's Meeting wool felting trunk show by Pamela Marshall.
 October's Workshop is a felted wool Harvest Pumpkin Wall Hanging.

This will be a fun project for fall. Harvest Pumpkin is an original design by the instructor, Pamela Marshall from Stars and Scraps Quilt Store in Corona.

In this workshop you will learn:

- 1. All of the embroidery stitches required to complete this project.
- 2. How to prepare the fabric and wool for applique.
- 3. How to transfer your design to the fabric.
- 4. Helpful techniques when working with wool.

A supply list is available when you sign up. Or you have the option to buy the kit for \$10.99. The kit includes the wool, fabric for background and back, and the binding. You will also be able to purchase the frame at the workshop.

Be sure to sign up and let us know if you want the kits so we can let Pamela know. Fee-\$20 for members-\$35 for non-members.








Opportunity Quilt 2015

Lorraine Taylor has become a familiar presence since she joined our guild in 2009...and it is past time that we Recognize and Honor her as a "Super Volunteer", on behalf of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild.

Lorraine has always been an entrepreneur, having spent ten years traveling in a RV with her husband & family, she was a natural to work for the Long Beach World Trade Cruises. With a combined 25 yrs. of experience, Lorraine especially enjoyed coordinating group scrapbooking & quilting cruises.

We all remember 9/11...Lorraine was on a Nova Scotia cruise & was impacted, as were many others, that close to New York. When she got home...Long Beach & nearby area quilters were rallying to make a giant quilt in honor of those who had lost their lives during 9/11... and hang it on the very building that Lorraine worked out of. The connection with these marvelous quilters was very healing experience for her.

Life handed Lorraine another blow in 2007 when her husband was diagnosed with cancer & died shortly thereafter. She spent two years in recovery mode & looking for a location to start the next chapter of her life...this time "Land Cruises"...crafters & quilters would come to her welcoming environment and experience a getaway at "Inspirations" Retreat Center.

By 2010, Lorraine was working with Jan Chapman on Programs and would also plan our annual Christmas Party. She would serve as our Program Chair for 5 years; weave in a few more Christmas Parties, and be the number one volunteer for selling Opportunity Quilt tickets to other guilds, from Long Beach to Orange County.




