
BLOCK OF THE MONTH



Workshop will be short classes for each project that are presented at the stations.


April's guest speaker will be Ritat Verroca. She will be presenting her fabulous trunk show.

FEBRUARY WORKSHOP WITH <u>SANDI CANNARELLA</u>

APPLIQUÉ—FAST, EASY METHOD FOR

BEGINNERS. Learn to appliqué using freezer paper and spray starch to achieve smooth and accurate curves, inside angles and sharp points and then learn to hide your stitches.

This is an opportunity for you new quilters to learn a new technique and for you more experienced quilters, a time to hone your skills and possibly assist a new quilter.

The workshop is Tuesday, February 19. It will start at 9:30am at out new location. Please contact me if you are interested in attending and I will get a supply and instruction list to you.





MOUNTAIN TREASURES XXV QUILT SHOW

We have had our first quilt show committee meeting and made a lot of progress in planning our new event. The name this year will be "Mountain Treasure's Silver Jubilee" on Labor Day weekend (8/31 - 9/1). We decided on some new signs, four new ribbons (Best Use of Color, Machine Embroidery, Domestic Machine Quilting and Longarm Machine Quilting,. Also a "Quilts for Sale" event and new flyers for our Show. We will have a sign over the inside gymnasium door, one for the Quilt Sale and a Silver Jubilee sign at a section honoring our 6 original members who will each show one of their favorite quilts, along with their biographies.

In addition to the new ribbons, we defined the existing "Novice" award as a new quilter who has started quilting in the past 12 months and is made by only one person (piecing and quilting). This category will be indicated on the Quilt Entry Form that must be checked by anyone claiming to be a "novice" - this is for our judge.

If anyone wants to sell quilts (no limit), there will be an extension of our Boutique in the back of the show where visitors can shop for quilts. Since this section is considered part of our boutique, members will be required to donate 15% of their quilt sale price to our guild. Also, if anyone wishes to sell her quilt that is hanging in the show, a "for sale" label will be provided for attaching to the quilt and a list of prices (assigned by the sellers) will be kept at the Quilt for Sale section. (Buyers will be required to pick up their purchase of a hanging quilt after the show).

Therefore, we will add 2 new stations that must be covered throughout the 2 days—the Quilt Sale section and the Silver Jubilee section. We also decided that two baskets of the usual six would be repeated this year due to their popularity: the Emergency Preparedness and the Sewing.

Instead of having 2 to 3 different flyers this year, we have chosen to have postcards only—a color photo of our Opportunity Quilt on the front, stamp and address section on one half of back and show info on the other half. This will cut down expenses for envelopes and stamps (oh, we are so smart). In addition, since we have purchased 12 tables of our own, that is 12 <u>Less</u> to be rented for the weekend.

Here is a great secret for cleaning out and decluttering from Audrey Mirksy-Ashby.


It's called "Strive for Five" and is very simple She writes, "It is not about fruits and vegetables—it's about getting rid of 5 things every day. It's really not that hard. Over the course of many months, you will actually see some progress. All the magazines and books about getting organized and cleaning out, tell you to set aside 15 minutes a day and tackle the chores in that way. But I can always think of something I'd rather to (instead.)

Strive for Five has worked for me (or is working, I should say). Just yesterday, I threw out receipts I had since 1991. Today I found receipts from 1992, 93, 94. (For some reason I used to save all my receipts)

It is easy to throw out 3 things and therefore easy to accomplish this goal and feel good about it." Audrey says you don't have to do this every day, but try to set up a habit and stick to your goal. (Any other tips out there? This might be an inspirational thread for those of us who need a nudge to get something accomplished.)
