General Meeting Minutes

May 19, 2025

I. Call to order

President Lindy Edmond called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 11:00 a.m. on May 19, 2025 at the Youth Center, Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca. Pledge of Allegiance led by Michele Parris.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the April 21, 2025 General Meeting as published in the May 2025 newsletter were approved on a motion by Belinda Evans, second by Elaine Dobiesz. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

- a) **Treasurer Report** – Tammy Laubach reported the April, 2025 treasurer's reports. At the end of April, the checking account balance was \$14,367.29. The savings account balance was \$17,744.96. Sue Bost motioned to approve the treasurer's report and Belinda Evans seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- b) **Membership** – Jeannie Mazzacane reported 47 members and 3 guests were introduced. Coffee Chat was discussed and the next date is to be determined. There was nothing in the Idea Box and Lindy Edmond invited members to use the Idea Box.
- c) **Sunshine and Shadows** - Theresa Georgi announced the birthdays for May. She invited the members to sing "Happy Birthday" to the birthday members present.
- d) **Philanthropy** – Cathy Fraser was absent. Belinda Evans reminded members that this is the last year for Seven Stars and the need for more quilts to support them. Belinda reported the need for members to complete their philanthropy in order to enter quilts in the Quilt Show and/or place items in the marketplace. Belinda indicated there are fabric strips and dog bed forms to pick up. Linda Salka shared that she received 20 bears today. Linda will be contacting the first responders about the need for the 60 bears she has on hand.

- f) **2025 Opportunity Quilt** – Lorraine Taylor asked members to sign up for showing the quilt at members' organizations. Lorraine had sign up sheets for the Wine Walk in June and the yard sale this weekend.

The workshops are on Tuesday after our Monday guild meeting. The workshop begins at 9:30am in the Historical Chapel. Bring your own lunch.

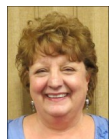

All quilts need to have a label on the back and placed in a white trash bag.

All entries will be displayed at the quilt show. Quilt show visitors love and need to see our creativity.

All the quilts need to be picked up after the July meeting. I am happy to hold on to any quilts after the July meeting, if needed, until the drop-off date for the quilt show.

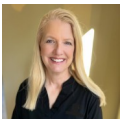

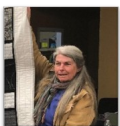

Don't forget to make a mug rug (wrapped in a fat quarter) to exchange!! Any size is good and if not sure how to make.. google search it!

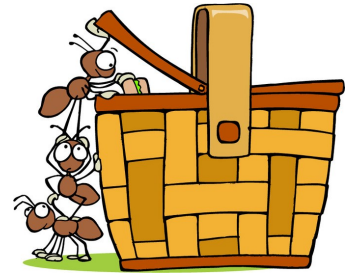

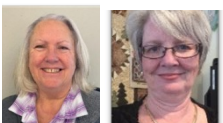
COMFORT QUILTS & TEDDY BEARS

Guidelines: Please use the sign in and sign out sheets when taking or returning your project. **Do** a quick housekeeping on your project (loose threads, pet hair, etc.) **Remember** no "Made by" labels on projects. **All projects** to be turned in at monthly general meetings at Philanthropy table. **Do not** just leave items at Philanthropy table, **label** your bag that the item(s) are in to ensure you get credit for them. **If you** plan to enter something in the annual show your comfort quilt or bears must be received no later than August 1, 2025. **Quilt tops** are not accepted. **Tops** must be quilted and finished.

- **Bear Valley Hospice and Dove's** comfort quilts suggested size: 44" - 46" by 58" - 62".
- **Moms & Dads** Project baby quilts suggested size: 36" by 36".
- **Seven Stars Foundation** provides quilts for children of military families, aged 5 - 17 who attend YMCA camps across the nation. Suggested size: Lap to twin. Fabric available.
- **Kids in Crisis** program makes teddy bears and bunnies for first responders to carry in their vehicles and hand out as needed when responding to emergencies.

You are always welcome to use your own fabrics and designs for these projects.

The Busy Bears Quilt Guild provides batting and backing as well.

MAY WORKSHOP - CRAZY QUILTS WITH ROBIN DAVIS

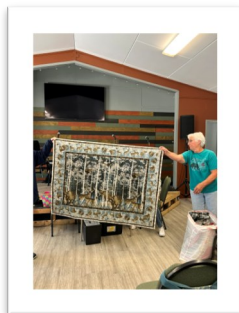

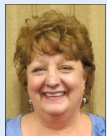
ELKS CRAFT FAIR

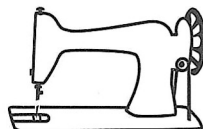
