General Meeting Minutes

April 20, 2026

I. Call to order

Laurie Hancock called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 11:04 a.m. on April 20, 2026 at the Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca. Pledge of Allegiance led by Michele Parris.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the March 16, 2026 General Meeting as published in the April 2026 newsletter and available on our membership sign-in table were approved on a motion by Jeannie Mazacanne, second by Deanna Melzian. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

- a) **Treasurer Report** – Tammy Laubach reported the March 2026 treasurer's report. At the end of March, the checking account balance was \$20,537.52. The savings account balance for March was \$17,761.25. Tammy announced the Guild will move money from the checking to savings. Tammy highlighted the 2024 and 2025 Quilt Show financial reports. She noted that the Opportunity Quilt funds were added in. 2024 netted \$1000 more than 2025. Higher expenses were incurred for 2025. Fran Martin motioned to approve the March treasurer's reports and Sue Bost seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- b) **Membership** – Fran Martin reported she is accepting memberships for 2026 and has 36 members. One guest, Fran's daughter, Leigh, was welcomed. There was nothing to report in the Idea Box. Laurie Hancock announced new membership cards are here and passed them out to members present. Members can present to quilt shops for discounts.
- c) **Sunshine and Shadows** - Theresa Georgi announced the birthdays for April. She invited the members to sing "Happy Birthday" to the birthday members present.
- d) **Philanthropy** – Cathy Fraiser announced there are kits. Bears, bunnies, dog beds came in. Nancy Gaylord contacted Doves and Mom & Dad Project. She delivered 38 bunnies.
- e) **Publicity and Marketing** - Open position. Brief discussion needing someone for publicity, social media, etc.
- f) **2026 Opportunity Quilt** – Lorraine Taylor requested members to show the quilt. She will find a venue, the Village, to show the quilt over Memorial Day weekend. Kelley Smythe and Michele Parris volunteered.
- g) **2027 Opportunity Quilt** – Bonnie Snell reported the center is completed. Lys Axelson will work on parts this week. Laurie Nahay volunteered to do the binding.

- h) **Programs** – Cathy Fraiser reported the survey was responded by two-thirds of the members with good ideas. Cathy said members want to have a Quilt Show but no one will volunteer to chair it. She said two people can co-chair and have committees do portions of the show. Venues were discussed and the high costs. She invited the members to speak on ideas as to where the Guild wants to go as a guild. The following ideas were shared. Adult sewing class may be a way to draw interest in the Guild. Meetings are too much business and fundraisers although we are a charity and must have business meetings (scares people away). We can partner with other organizations such as the Art Council and Soroptimists. Soroptimists have a Home Show (maybe we can partner with) like the Long Beach Guild does – one day yard displays Home Show. We can have a Saturday Quilt Show / demonstration (one day) at the Church. The Moonridge Corridor will be doing events and we could be a part of that. OCI patio could be a Guild and family event showing quilts. The point is to show quilts and get more people involved in the Guild (as opposed to making money at a Show). Labor Day weekend is too busy with many events around the valley – members were open to doing a Show at a different date such as October as the Octoberfest draws a lot of people to the valley. A park event such as Veterans Park to show quilts and students' creations. Visit other Guilds such as Wrightwood's Home Show and Quilt Show. It's too late this year to do a Quilt Show but hopefully next year. Cathy Fraiser said she will do another survey with different questions.

- m) **Quilt Show** – Cathy Fraiser spoke earlier at today's programs clarifying she is not the Quilt Show Chair. She is asking the members to complete the surveys she sends out. She's inviting members to submit ideas on where the members want the Guild to go, focus on, events, direction. It's clear the members want a Quilt Show but needs a chair or co-chair. Everyone must participate.
- n) **Challenge Quilt** – Wendy Stephens was absent. Due at July meeting.
- o) **Newsletter** – Janice Stillwell had nothing to report.
- p) **Grow Your Own Garden** – Laurie Hancock and Lys Axelson had nothing to report. Due at August meeting.
- q) **Hospitality** – Laurie Hancock thanked the members who hosted today noting the sign-up sheet is at the front table.
- r) **Budget 2026 Committee** – Nothing to report.
- s) **Stitchy Fingers** – Laurie Hancock invited members to Stitchy Fingers, which meets every 2nd and 4th Friday of the month, 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. Laurie sends out an email to those interested. Laurie said the next Stitchy Fingers is this Friday, April 24, at Laurie Nahay's home in Apple Valley. Carpool there. Laurie Nahay will have a salad bar lunch. Field trip to Hobby Lobby and Michaels. Graduates of our Adult Sewing Camp would have honorary membership for one year. Tammy Laubach shared an idea to once-per-month in the summer months to show the Opportunity Quilt and demonstrate hand sewing at the local museum. If anyone is interested, please talk to Tammy. Laurie Hancock shared that the San Luis Obispo guild puts out a list of mentors among their members. She invited members to volunteer to do the same for our guild. Laurie Hancock expressed the need for a quilt for Linda Salka. Cathy Frasier will find the hearts material for tomorrows sew. Night meetings begin in June.

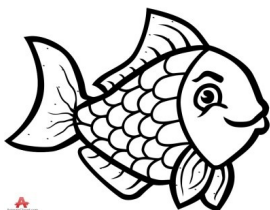

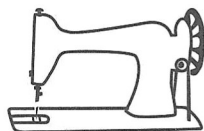
