October 16, 2023

President Lindy Edmond called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 6:00 p.m. on October 16, 2023, at Youth Center of Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the September 25, 2023, General Meeting as published in the October newsletter were approved on a motion by Belinda Evans, second by Debra Lanning. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

- a) **Treasurer Report** Michele Rustigan reported the September ending balance as \$23,174.08. Motion to approve the Guild's September treasurer's report will take place at the November general meeting. Michele Rustigan will continue to be treasurer in 2024.
- b) **Memberships** Laurie Nahay was absent. Gladys Panameno reported 83 members. And can begin turning in one's 2024 membership in November. Lindy Edmond reported there no new submittals in the Idea Box.
 - Survey Monkey vote resulted in the following: 1. All daytime meetings meetings to begin at 11 a.m., lunch to follow received **26 votes**. 2. All nighttime meetings meetings to begin at 6 p.m., pre-dinner at 4 p.m. received **4 votes**. 3. Split daytime and nighttime meetings (times above). 


